WHAT IS CARFERS HIVE?

Careers Hive is an education event by Edinburgh International Science Festival. It provides 11-14 year-olds an immersive introduction to the future of work. It highlights the breadth of opportunities available if they continue to engage with science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) throughout their education.

Careers Hive 2019 will take place in the National Museum of Scotland, Edinburgh from 25 February to 1 March. Throughout the week 3,000 students will be guided through three-hour sessions featuring an interactive exhibition, hands-on workshops, and inspirational talks. During the experience they will be able to engage with industry professionals.

MEET THE PROFESSIONAL

Explain to school groups what you love about your job, how you got there and your future industry predictions. Add a little extra with hands-on acctivities that explain what you do.

THINK TANK

Lightning meetings with small groups (three to six participants) where you will answer questions about your job in five minutes.

COMMUNICATION TRAINING

Receive expert training in communication and public engagement as you complete a half-day Communicating with Confidence course. This course has been developed by Edinburgh International Science Festival, informed by decades of experience in science communication across the world

Further develop your communication skills by engaging with participants at Careers Hive - answering questions, helping them with practical tasks and encouraging them to think about future careers.
